

DePaul University McHenry County College Transfer Guide RN to MSN (online program)

(2019/2020 Catalog)

Transfer guides are produced as a service to MCC students. Every effort is made to maintain up-to-date and accurate information; however, this information is subject to change. Such changes take precedence over the information on this guide. Students should work with an MCC advisor and the four-year transfer school. Responsibility for complying with all applicable requirements ultimately rests with the student.

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DePaul's curriculum for nursing is approved by the Committee on Nursing of the Illinois Department of Professional Regulation and is fully accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education. The RN to MSN program provides an opportunity for students to move from an associate degree to a master's degree, earning a bachelor's degree on the way. The curriculum outlined here is for students with an associate degree in nursing only. RNs with a bachelor's degree in a non-nursing area along with the associate degree in nursing need only complete the MS in nursing. - **Online** The program allows for continued full-time employment and is designed to accommodate the working adult who has professional and family demands.
- 4 tracks to choose from at the MS level: Family Nurse Practitioner; Adult-Gerontology Nurse Practitioner; Nursing Education; Nursing Administration.
- Credentials Upon completion of the program, you will earn the following credentials:
 - Bachelor of Science (BS) in nursing from DePaul
 - Master of Science (MS) in nursing from DePaul
 Nursing Education or Nursing Administration Tracks only:
 - Certificate of Health Professions Education <u>or</u> Health Administration from Rosalind Franklin
 University of Medicine and Science (RFUMS). Both certificates are accredited credentials. DePaul is
 partnering with RFUMS to provide this opportunity.
- Length of Program The program varies depending on the track chosen at the master's level. Generally, it can be completed in three to four years by taking two courses per term. Six bachelor's degree courses will be credited toward master's work, shortening time to graduation.
- Tuition 34 quarter hours are billed at the graduate rate. The remainder is billed at the undergraduate rate of \$655/per quarter hour (2019-2020). Based on transferrable credits, the number of hours required could vary.

Admission Information

- Application and admission For details, please refer to admission information on DePaul's website.
- Application deadline rolling we suggest that students apply 4 to 6 weeks before the start of a term.
- Minimum GPA 2.75 cumulative GPA. Minimum of "C" grade in Statistics course (prerequisite).
- Admission requirements (brief summary see DePaul website for detailed requirements)
 - Graduate from state-approved diploma school of nursing or an associate degree from a ACEN or CNEA accredited nursing program
 - Licensed as a registered nurse from a US state with eligibility to practice in the state where clinical will take place.
 - An official transcript showing completion of the following courses with a grade of C or better (must be completed at time of enrollment, not application):
 - Statistics (MAT120 General Education Statistics or MAT220 Statistics)

Additional Courses at MCC

NOTE: The following are DePaul course requirements and can be taken at MCC in addition to AAS in Nursing requirements.

Notes on Quarter/Semester Hour Conversion

DePaul University's academic calendar is based on the quarter system. College credit is accumulated on the basis of quarter hours. To convert credit hours from the quarter system to the semester system, multiply the number of quarter hours by .67 (or 2/3) (example: 4 quarter hours x 2/3 - 2 2/3 semester hours). To convert credit hours from the semester system to the quarter system, multiply the number of semester hours by 1.5 (example: 3 semester hours x 1.5 = 4.5 quarter hours).
