

Northern Illinois University RN to BS Transfer Guide 2018/2019 Catalog

School of Nursing

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Transfer guides are produced as a service to MCC students. Every effort is made to maintain up-to-date and accurate information; however, this information is subject to change. Such changes take precedence over the information on this guide. Students should work with an MCC advisor and the four-year transfer school. Responsibility for complying with all applicable requirements ultimately rests with the student.

Northern Illinois University (NIU) and McHenry County College (MCC) have entered into a 3+1 degree completion agreement between the AAS in Nursing and the BS in Nursing. All courses are offered online, and you can enter the program in fall, spring or summer. NIU's curriculum for the BS in Nursing is approved by the Committee on Nursing of the Illinois Department of Professional Regulation and is fully accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education.

Admission Information

- RN students are considered for admission as soon as their NIU application materials have been processed. Upon admission to NIU students should contact the nursing department directly to verify all nursing application materials have arrived. Prospective RN-BS completion students cannot be reviewed for admission to nursing until they are admitted to the university and have all nursing application materials (RN license, transcripts, etc.) on file in the nursing office.
- **University Application Deadlines** – Spring 2019 - December 1, 2018; Summer 2019 – May 15, 2019; Fall 2019 – August 1, 2019. Students are strongly encouraged to apply to NIU well ahead of these deadlines. The entire admission process typically lasts 4-6 weeks.
- **Admission requirements** (see NIU website for details)
 - Admission to the University,
 - Evidence of meeting one of the following, within the past 5 years: employment as a registered nurse, graduation from an approved associate degree nursing program, or completion of an approved refresher course
 - Minimum cumulative 2.75 GPA
 - Must achieve a minimum grade of C or better in all attempted prerequisite courses
 - Licensure to practice nursing in the state of Illinois

Additional Information

- The RN to BSN program is designed to award credit to registered nurses for their recent education and previous learning experiences in the field of nursing.
 - The RN student will receive 33 semester hours of credit for NURS 303, 305, 313, 314, 315, 318, 319, 323, 333, 336, 343, 422, and 433. The credit is held in "escrow" and posted to the student's transcript upon successful completion of 12 semester hours of NIU nursing credit (must include NURS 347) with a grade of C or better.
Students who graduated more than 5 years ago and have not practiced as a registered nurse within the last 5 years will need to demonstrate competency through successful completion of an approved refresher course.
- RN students whose cumulative GPA falls below 2.75 after completing 9 semester hours at NIU will be dismissed from the nursing major.
- The following options satisfy NIU's general education requirements for transfer students:
 - Illinois Articulation Initiative General Education Core Curriculum (IAI GECC)
 - An MCC AA or AS degree

- The RN to BSN program at NIU requires 120 semester hours of credit.
 - Included in the 120 required NIU credits are general education, prerequisite, and nursing coursework.
 - The program consists of 61 NIU semester hour credits:
 - 33 credits through recent education in an AAS program and previous learning experiences in the field of nursing
 - 28 credits through NIU Nursing coursework.
 - The additional 59 credits include prerequisite and general education coursework, which can be completed through a community college.
- Tuition** - 28 credits in coursework is required from NIU. All other degree requirements can be met with MCC coursework.

Education Plan

- This plan includes coursework that satisfies MCC's AAS in Nursing and NIU general education and prerequisite requirements.
- Courses shown with **bold print** specifically are required by NIU. Minimum grade of C or better is required. (Some of these required courses also apply toward general education coursework.)
