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Transfer guides are produced as a service to MCC students. Every effort is made to maintain up-to-date and accurate information; however, this information is subject to change. Such changes take precedence over the information on this guide. Students should work with an MCC advisor and the four-year transfer school. Responsibility for complying with all applicable requirements ultimately rests with the student.

The BS Ed in physical education K-12 program is designed for students who plan to teach physical education at the elementary, intermediate, or secondary level. Students who receive physical education K-12 licensure may add endorsement(s) to current license. Additional course work is necessary.

The BS program in kinesiology is designed for students preparing for professional opportunities in athletic training, health behavior, sport performance, and cardiac rehabilitation settings. The program provides a rigorous program of study combining classroom, laboratory, field experiences, and a culminating internship that prepare students to become professionals in the health and fitness industry.

Transfer Options

Due to the sequencing and number of required major courses recommended for completion during the sophomore year for Physical Education majors, it may be beneficial to transfer the sophomore year. Work closely with an academic advisor.

- **Guaranteed Admission** - Provides MCC students with the opportunity for guaranteed admission to the University and academic advisement from both MCC academic advisors and NIU transfer personnel.
- **AA or AS Degree** - Transfer students who receive an AA or an AS degree from an Illinois public community college, have not previously attended NIU, are in good standing at the last college attended, and have a cumulative GPA of 2.00 or higher are guaranteed the following:
 - Minimum of 60 semester hours in transfer credit
 - Junior status
 - Lower division NIU General Education requirements satisfied (Additional course requirements may be needed for specific NIU majors.)
- **Illinois Articulation Initiative** - Transfer students who enter NIU as first time students with the IAI General Education Core Curriculum (IAI GECC) completed are considered to have completed NIU's general education requirements. Specific majors may require additional coursework.
- **For students who transfer prior to completing an AA or an AS degree or the IAI core:**
 - **NIU credit can be transferred back to MCC for completion of the AA or the AS degree. Ask your MCC academic advisor about the Reverse Transfer Agreement partnership with NIU.**
 - If only a portion of the IAI GECC is completed upon transfer, NIU will evaluate on a course by course basis to see how each course fits into NIU's General Education. The IAI GECC may not be completed at NIU.

Admission and Program Notes

- Students must be admitted to Northern Illinois University through the Office of Admissions.
- **Application deadlines:** Fall (August 1), Spring (December 1), Summer (May 15)
All required documents must be on file at NIU by the deadline dates. Early application recommended.
- **GPA Calculation** – NIU uses the sending institutions transcribed cumulative GPA for admission purposes. Certain majors require special admission grading policies.
- **Grade Requirement** – General education and major course related grade requirements vary based on intended program. For general education and major course related grade requirements, see program specific admission notes below.

Physical Education Admission Notes - Following requirements must be met prior to clinical course enrollment. (admission to KNPE343 constitutes admission to the program)

- **Basic Skills Testing Requirement** - Successful completion of one of the following basic skills exams is required.
 - **Illinois Test of Academic Proficiency (TAP)**
 - **ACT**
 - ACT Plus Writing with composite Score of 22 or higher and minimum of 6 in writing – Two score reports may be submitted: one with a passing composite score and one with a passing writing score. (Note: ACT changed its scoring for the writing portion. Prior to 9/1/16, the scoring for the writing portion was 16.)
 - If ACT was taken prior to 9/1/15 – ACT Plus Writing with minimum composite score of 22 and minimum score of 19 on English/Writing portion
 - **SAT** composite score of 1110 (evidence based Reading and Writing + Math) and a minimum score of 26 on Writing and Language. (Note: SAT changed its scoring. Prior to 5/5/16, scoring was SAT composite score of 1030 (critical reading + mathematics = 1030 or higher) and a minimum score of 450 on writing.)
 - **Superscoring is now available on ACT/SAT.** If you do not have an overall passing composite score, the ISBE will add the highest subject scores from each test and divide by the total number of tests for a composite score. You must email Licensure@isbe.net if you would like your tests superscored.
 - Scores must come from the same assessments. For example, a passing composite ACT score and a passing SAT writing score is not acceptable.
- Overall minimum NIU GPA of 2.75
- Grade of C in all foundational studies requirements (MCC equivalents: ENG151, ENG152, SPE151, IAI Math except Math 201)
- Strongly recommend completing the following prior to transfer
 - BIO 263 & 264
 - Mathematics Foundation Course – Select one of following: MAT120, 150, 165, 170, 171, 175, or 220
 - PSY151
- **Due to the sequencing and number of required major courses recommended for completion during the sophomore year, it may be beneficial to transfer the sophomore year.**

Kinesiology Admission Notes

- Following courses are recommended prior to transfer (C or better).

- No courses required for the major in or outside the department can be taken on a pass/fail basis.
- **With careful planning and dependent on completed course work, it is possible for students majoring in this emphasis to complete the AA degree at MCC and then to complete the baccalaureate degree at NIU in a timely manner.**
- Strongly recommend completing required science and math courses at MCC before transferring to NIU.
- The NIU Kinesiology program is direct entry. There are no additional admission requirements to begin the program. However, students must have a cumulative NIU GPA of a 2.5 or higher to complete the culminating internship experience during the final semester of coursework.

Additional Information

- **Maximum hours from a community college** - Up to 66 academic semester hours from a community college and 4 semester hours of physical education activity credits may be applied toward a degree at NIU.
- **Catalog Rule** - Students may choose the NIU catalog which was in effect when they became freshmen at their original school or any later NIU catalog, providing they were enrolled during the catalog year of their choice. The catalog year must not precede enrollment at NIU by more than three years. Students may elect to satisfy all graduation requirements from a single catalog or major and minor requirements from one and general education requirements from a second. **Please note that mandatory Illinois state standards for teacher education majors takes precedence over the Catalog Rule.**

Course Recommendations

The following table shows coursework for students who wish to complete the IAI core at MCC or who wish to complete individual courses that will transfer into NIU's general education core. **Please note following:**

- **The IAI core and NIU's general core are different. It is important that you select one or the other.** The IAI core satisfies NIU's general education requirement.
- If you plan to complete MCC's AA degree, you must complete the IAI core curriculum.

Work with an MCC advisor when selecting courses for transfer.
