

# McHenry County College AAS in Nursing to Purdue University Northwest RN to BSN (Online)

(2016-2017 Catalog)

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The BSN degree program is accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN) and the Indiana State Board of Nursing Professional Licensing Agency. It is designated as a Center of Excellence In Nursing Education by the National League for Nursing.

### **Application and Admission Requirements**

- Complete <u>Purdue University Northwest Application</u> and submit application fee and transcript review fee.
   Applicant must be officially accepted by the university before application can be considered by admission to the College of Nursing.
- Minimum GPA of 2.5/4.0.

Successfully completed an associate degree or diploma in nursing from an ACEN (Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing) program.

- Licensure as a Registered Nurse.
- Completion of 62 semester credit hours of lower division courses, distributed as follows:
  - o 17 credits in approved science courses (MCC courses: BIO157, BIO255, BIO263, BIO264, HFE250)
  - 12 credits in humanities and social sciences (MCC courses: ENG151, PHI251 or 252, PSY151, PSY250)
  - o 3 credits in elective courses (MCC course: HCE110, HCE111)
  - 30 credits in Nursing Courses
- Students must be graduated and licensed prior to admission.
- All official transcripts from all previous schools attended must be submitted.

#### **Additional Information**

- Maximum transfer credit The RN-BSN program requires 120 credits. 34 nursing credits must be completed through Purdue University Northwest. The remaining credits can be transferred from a community college.
- Grade requirement A grade of C or higher all prerequisites and nursing courses.
- The 34 credits of nursing coursework can be completed in a minimum of 16 months (5 week terms).
- Tuition per credit hour \$350/semester hour.
