MCC and SIUC have entered into a Program Articulation Agreement between the AAS in Culinary Management and the BS in Hospitality and Tourism Administration. The agreement takes full advantage of SIUC's Capstone Option, which reduces the SIUC University Core Curriculum from 41 semester hours to 30 semester hours.

The program is offered on the SIUC campus or at University Center in Lake County, Grayslake. Courses are offered online and at University Center in Grayslake.

Admission

A McHenry County College graduate receiving an AAS in Culinary Management will be considered for the Capstone Option and admission to SIUC's Hospitality and Tourism Administration program, if the following are met:

- Completion of SIUC undergraduate admissions application and admission to the University
- Minimum cumulative 2.00 GPA for collegiate work as calculated by SIUC
- Completion of at least 15 credit hours of transferable SIUC University Core Curriculum credit, as noted on the second page of this guide
- Completion of the major related courses specified on the second page of this guide

A McHenry County College student transferring to the Hospitality and Tourism Administration degree program at SIUC who has not completed the AAS in Culinary Management at MCC will have related coursework evaluated on a course-by-course basis, will not be eligible to receive the Capstone benefits, and will be considered based upon enrollment criteria and space availability.

Note: SIUC's Dual Admission Program allows baccalaureate oriented freshman students at community colleges to benefit from pre-advisement through SIUC for a chosen major at SIUC. For more information: http://admissions.siu.edu/dap/.
