University of Wisconsin – Whitewater College of Business and Economics

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Transfer guides are produced as a service to MCC students. Every effort is made to maintain up-to-date and accurate information; however, this information is subject to change. Such changes take precedence over the information on this guide. Students should work with an MCC advisor and check with the four-year school as soon as the transfer decision is made. Responsibility for complying with all applicable requirements ultimately rests with the student.

The College of Business and Economics is accredited by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB) International. Major programs include accounting, economics, finance, information technology, international business, management, marketing, human resource management, entrepreneurship, integrated science and business, general business and supply chain and operations management. General Business and Marketing are also offered entirely online.

Transfer Options

- With AA or AS Degree University-wide general education courses are satisfied with completion of an AA or an AS degree from MCC with the exception of the U.S Ethnic/Diversity requirement. Students should remind UW-Whitewater advisors that they have earned the associate degree to ensure they are not needlessly advised into general education courses. Individual majors may require specific general core courses.
- Without AA or AS Degree Students who do not earn the AA or the AS before transferring will need to complete specific UW-Whitewater general education courses.

Admission

- Application to University priority deadline: Fall, July 1; Spring, December 1. Students are encouraged to submit an application earlier than the priority deadlines.
- UW Whitewater application is required for admission to the University. Students can declare a business major at any point in their studies if the minimum combined GPA and credits earned are met.
- Minimum combined GPA requirements for declaring a business major
 - O Students with 0 to 24 credits: 2.00
 - O Students with 24 to 72 credits: 2.50
 - Students with 73 or more credits: 2.80
- Admission to lower division business courses requires 24 transferrable credits and a 2.50 combined GPA
- Admission to upper division business courses requires completion of
 - o 54 transferable credits (including pre-business core listed below). Business students are eligible to enroll in lower-division business courses after completing 24 credits with at least a 2.5 GPA.
 - o 2.80 GPA.
 - O Complete or be enrolled in the following courses:

Additional Information

- International Requirement College of Business and Economics graduation requirement satisfied by taking one of the following courses: BUS175; GEG202, 203, 204; HIS165; PHI160, 261; PLT251, 255, 281. Students should meet with their Academic Advisor in the College of Business and Economics at UW-Whitewater to ensure the selected course is properly noted in the students' advising report. .
- Diversity Requirement a UW Whitewater graduation requirement and is satisfied by taking SOC260
- Maximum hours accepted from a community college Up to 72 credits may be transferred from a community college toward the 120 credits required for graduation. Although additional credits may transfer, additional credits will be required for graduation. Students must earn a minimum of 48 credits from a four year institution.
- Calculation for Admission GPA Transfer grades for all MCC transferable course work attempted is calculated into the admission GPA. Remedial courses in math and English are also calculated in the transfer GPA. For repeat coursework, a course in which a grade of C- or below was originally earned may be repeated once for grade and earned credit replacement. The grade and credits earned for the repeated course will replace those earned in the initial attempt when calculating grade point average and credits toward degree. This repeat policy is used in recalculating GPA for admission purposes.
- Catalog rule Students are responsible for meeting all degree requirements in effect at the UWW at the time that they declare their UWW major, unless they interrupt their attendance at Whitewater by an absence of four or more consecutive academic terms (including Summer), in which case upon re-entry they will be subject to the requirements in effect at that time.

Education Plan – Completion of this program will satisfy MCC's AA degree requirements, UWW's general education requirements and the College of Business and Economics core requirements, noted in bold print (exception- ITSCM280).
