University of Wisconsin at Whitewater

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Transfer guides are produced as a service to MCC students. Every effort is made to maintain up-to-date and accurate information; however, this information is subject to change. Such changes take precedence over the information on this guide. Students should work with an MCC advisor and the four-year transfer school. Responsibility for complying with all applicable requirements ultimately rests with the student.

Transfer Options

- With AA or AS Degree University-wide general education courses are satisfied with completion of an AA or an AS degree from MCC. Students should remind UW-Whitewater advisors that they have earned the associate degree to ensure they are not needlessly advised into general education courses. Individual majors may require specific general education core courses. An official transcript confirming the degree must be submitted to the Admissions Office.
- Without AA or AS Degree Students who do not earn the AA or the AS before transferring will need to complete specific UW-Whitewater general education courses. See chart on last page of this guide for requirements.

- Application Priority Deadlines Fall, July 1; Spring, December 1
- Admission Criteria
 - Earned 12 + semester hours of college-level transferable courses at the time of application; cumulative 2.0 GPA (Note: Some majors require a higher GPA.)
 - Earned fewer than 12 semester hours of college-level transferable courses at the time of application must meet freshman admission requirements.

Additional Information

- GPA Calculation for Admission to University Transfer grades for all MCC transferable course work attempted is calculated into the admission GPA. Remedial courses in math and English are also calculated in the transfer GPA. For repeat coursework, a course in which a grade of C- or below was originally earned may be repeated once for grade and earned credit replacement. The grade and credits earned for the repeated course will replace those earned in the initial attempt when calculating grade point average and credits toward degree. This repeat policy is used in recalculating GPA for admission purposes.
- Maximum hours from a community college Up to 72 credits may be transferred from a community college toward
 the 120 credits required for graduation. Although additional credits may transfer, additional credits will be required
 for graduation. Students must earn a minimum of 48 credits from a four year institution.
- Proficiency credit (including CLEP and AP) UW-Whitewater awards credit by examination for the following
 programs: Advanced Placement (AP), the College Level Examination Program (CLEP) and the International
 Baccalaureate (IB). Students who have earned credit by examination should have official test scores sent to UWW's
 Office of Testing. Scores will be evaluated for credit according to the equivalencies listed in UW-Whitewater's Testing
 Office website www.uww.edu/testing
- Special Requirements in Addition to University General Education
 - College of Arts and Communications Majors
 - BA Degree one course of at least two credits in Arts outside the major, plus six credits in Humanities courses
 - BFA and Bachelor of Music one course of at least two credits in Arts outside the major
 - BS at least six credits in Natural Science/ mathematics in addition to the laboratory science/additional science-mathematics requirement

College of Education (Teacher Certificate) Majors - Students seeking licensure to teach are required to complete
40 credits of general education requirements. These are called PI 34 Requirements and are named after the
Wisconsin Statute which covers teacher certification. These requirements are not satisfied by the AA or AS degree
but may be incorporated into the associate degree curriculum.

College of Letters and Sciences Majors

- BA Degree
 - Demonstrate basic competency in a foreign language equivalent to one year of study at the college level (met either by passing a second semester (or higher) college-level foreign language course or by demonstrating the required level of proficiency through examination)
 - Six credits at the junior/senior level must be taken in Arts, Humanities, or Social Sciences must be completed. These cannot be completed at MCC.
- BS Degree
 - Two 4 or 5 credit laboratory sciences from 2 different disciplines
 - 5 credits of additional mathematics beyond Intermediate Algebra or 6 credits from two of the three options: additional mathematics beyond intermediate algebra, statistics, and computer science.

UWW's General Education requirements and MCC's equivalent courses

This chart is intended for students who will be transferring before earning an associate's degree. Your major may require specific general education coursework. University-wide general core is satisfied with an AA or an AS degree. All students must complete one Diversity course requirement. Following MCC course satisfy requirement: SOC260.

*Requirements with an asterisk are based on credits transferred:

- 20 credits or less each course must be completed
- 21-39 credits Gened 390 and one additional course with asterisk
- 40 credits or more Gened390
